- Tidy their desk after they finish their work



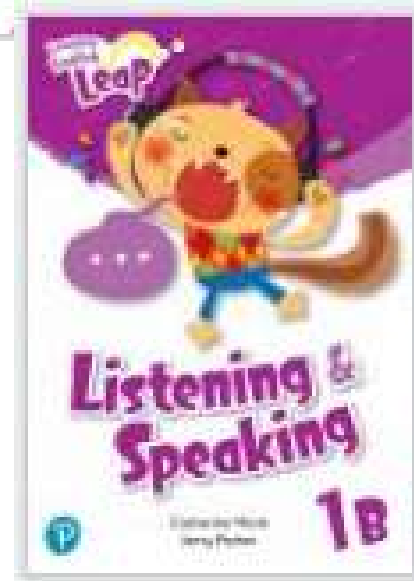
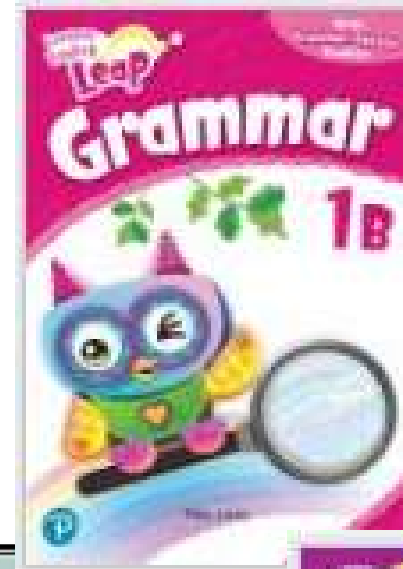
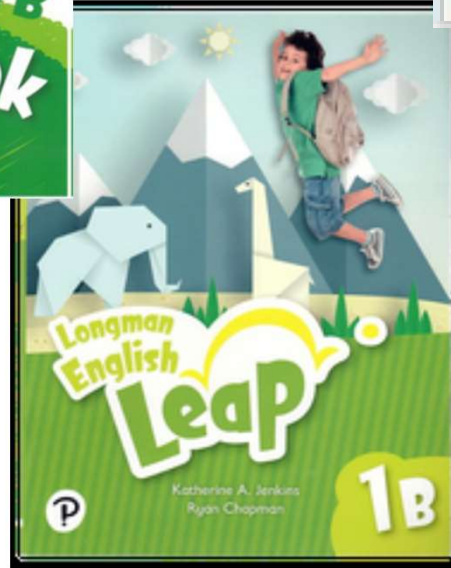
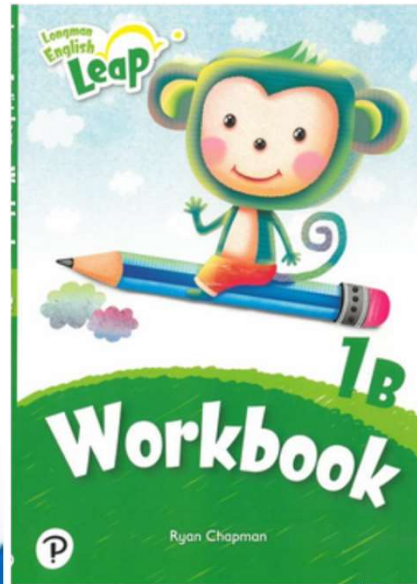
Read to your child & ask your child to read to you

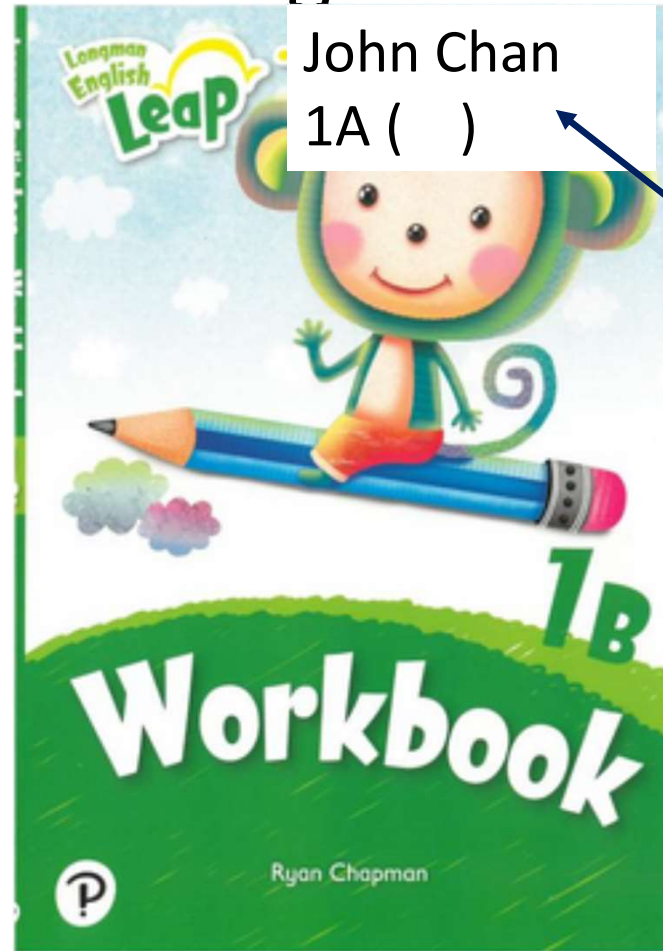
